THE PURPOSE OF THIS NEWSLETTER IS TO INFORM YOU OF THE TOPICS THAT YOUR CHILDREN WILL BE STUDYING DURING THIS HALF TERM.

LONDON - OUR CAPITAL CITY

Reading

The children will be following the Read Write Inc programme to support their phonics and develop their fluency of reading.

As a class we will be focusing on the text 'Sam Wu is not afraid of sharks' by authors Kate and Kevin Tsang. The children will develop reading aloud skills and becoming a fluent reader with growing comprehension skills. The children will learn about unusual spelling patterns and tricky words as well as

they come across in their reading.

In Science the children will be learning about 'Habitats.' This project teaches children about habitats and what a habitat needs to provide for animals to survive. They explore local habitats to identify and name living things and begin to understand how they depend on one another for food and shelter. The children will describe a range of local habitats and habitats beyond their locality (beaches, rain forests, deserts, oceans and mountains) and what all habitats provide for the things that live there. They will also understand what a micro habitat is and what animals usually live in micro habitats.

R.E.

In R.E the children will be focusing on 'Why does Christmas matter to Christians?' The children will learn about the gifts that God gave and the reasons why Christmas is an important holiday for Christians. The children will learn about the Christmas story and the role that Jesus played. We will be focusing on the important points of the story and the children will be able to recognise that Jesus' birth and life can be found in the new testament and Gospels.

Home Reading

Home reading books will be sent home to support our Read Write Inc Phonics and reading programme, as well as books to encourage children to share stories with you and read for pleasure.

Please discuss these with your child and sign their reading record daily and return them to school each day. Each child will be entered into a reading challenge where they must read at least 3 times each week.

PSHE

In PSHE (Jigsaw) we will be working on 'Celebrating Difference.' This will cover accepting that everyone is different and how they can include others when working and playing. The children will focus on how to solve problems and the importance of using kind words.

Numeracy

Our main areas of study will be:

- Subtract a 1-digit number from a 2 digit number
- 10 more, 10 less
- Add and subtract 10s
- Add two 2-digit numbers
- Subtract two 2-digit numbers
- Compare number sentences
- Missing number problems
- Recognise 2-D and 3-D shapes
- Lines of symmetry
- Count the faces, edges and vertices of a 3D shape

We will be focusing on the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Your support at home with helping your children to learn their times tables will be greatly appreciated.

Geography

During geography lessons the children will learn about 'London - Our capital city' and answer the enquiry question 'How does London compare to Hull?' The children will learn about Hull and the ways in which they can recognise that it is a city. The children will learn about the significant landmarks of Hull and the human and physical features that Hull has. We will then focus on how London has many landmarks and the human and physical features of the capital city. By the end of the learning the children will be able to compare what they know about Hull and London and identify the similarities and differences they have.

Music

In music children will be exploring the pulse and rhythm of a piece of music by listening to different songs and playing instruments.

Computing

In computing we will be focusing on computer systems and networks, looking at the IT around us as well as the importance of being safe online. Year 2 will learn about how IT benefits society and how to be responsible when using technology.

In Design and Technology the children will be learning about 'Remarkable Recipes.' This includes learning about the sources of food and how to correctly and safely use tools for food preparation. They will discover how some foods are cooked and learn to read a simple recipe. The children will choose and make a new school meal that fulfils their specific

design criteria.

In PE the children will be focusing on developing their Social skills. PE lessons will usually be on a Wednesday.

PE kits should be brought into school every Monday and taken home to be washed every Friday. Children will need their PE kit of plain red shorts and plain white T Shirt, as well as their outdoor kit of plain black joggers and black jumper. Trainers are also required on this day.
