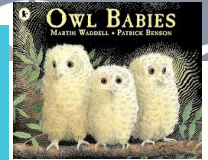


# CLASS RK- RECEPTION



We hope that you have all enjoyed a lovely summer break and that your child feels ready to start school and learn lots of new skills. We will be spending some time consolidating the nursery curriculum as well as teaching new skills and knowledge as appropriate.

Our topics for this half term will be: **All Are Welcome** and **Into the Woods**.

In addition, the children will continue their learning independently through play activities which will reflect their interests and learning needs, and we may adapt topics to cater for children's interests.

## Communication/ Language

We will be sharing our holiday news within key worker groups, as well as playing lots of speaking and listening games. We will encourage the children to develop their vocabulary and speak in full sentences.

## Mathematics

In Maths this half term we are focusing on matching, sorting and comparing objects. We will also be looking at measure and patterns before consolidating our knowledge of number in our 'It's me 1,2,3!' unit.

We will also be introducing our new Maths area and modelling how the resources can be used.

## Understanding the World

We will learn about the season Autumn in our outdoor forest school area. We will also learn about nocturnal animals such as owls and hedgehogs, and we will explore light and dark with torches and shadows.

## Reading books

Children should now have received their home reader and phonics book. These are to be returned on a Friday. At first these will be simple sound books and then they will progress onto blending books. Later in the school year they will begin to bring home 'proper' reading books. We will also change your home reader for you to share and enjoy over the weekend, to be returned on a Friday.

We will leave a basket under the canopy outside for books to be placed in each Friday.

## Literacy

We will share lots of stories and non-fiction books. Our focus texts for this half term are the stories 'All Are Welcome' by Alexandra Penfold, 'A little bit Brave' by Nicola Kinnear, 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell and 'The Squirrel's who squabbled' by Rachel Bright.

We will be continuing our journey on the 'Read, Write Inc' Phonics programme, firstly consolidating our learning and then learning our new letter sounds. When we learn a sound we will be learning what it looks like, how we say it and also having a go at writing each one. We will also be learning how to blend sounds together to hear words with the help of Fred the frog. We call this 'Fred talk'.

## PSED

Our Jigsaw topic for this half term is 'Being me in my world'. During Jigsaw lessons we will promote mindfulness and develop pupils' well-being. We will work on developing good relationships with friends, encouraging kindness and respect (two of our key Christian values).

## Physical development

We will encourage good hygiene and independence with dressing/undressing for P.E. Please could you also practise these skills at home? We will work on developing spatial awareness skills during P.E. lessons.

## R.E.

We will learn and use the school prayers. We will also learn about the Christian Harvest festival.

## Expressive Arts

We will be learning new rhymes, and use our bodies and instruments to create sounds. We will also work on colour, creating some self- portraits, and and texture to create Autumn pictures and collages.
